

CLUB 33 HISTORY MINUTE #22 1/7/2010

In gearing up for Rotary Club 33's Centennial in 2011, let's turn the clock back to 1964 – forty-five years ago. Taking the gavel that July was President Jim Haugh; classification City Bus Lines. Jim reinstated an old Rotary tradition of "Who Am I" talks; where newer members deliver vignettes about themselves, and the "Who Is He" items in THE ROTATOR challenged other members to guess who. A major youth project under Pres Jim's term was initiation of the Camp Princeton project to serve 50 children for United Cerebral Palsy of San Diego. Club 33 contributed \$1500 from our Service Fund that year. We also listened to some terrific programs by San Diego Union's Jack Murphy on a first-hand account of the Tokyo Olympics; and hypnotist Dr. Michael Dean on "The Misunderstood Husband". Our Holiday Program in 1964 featured solos by Ben Hayward, Orville Aftreth, and Homer Peabody. Also the Rotary Children's Chorus – containing a couple of today's Club 33 members sang as well. After the program, Club Secretary Henryetta discovered she'd misplaced a couple of gift bottles of scotch she'd received from a Rotarian or two...She later discovered she'd mixed them up with presents for the kids donated at the door for the Salvation Army Christmas Party!
